READ

Read the Bible with your kids, every day. Sounds like a lot, but it's worth it! Even if it's just for a few minutes. It is important to help them set up a pattern that they might keep the rest of their life. It might also be good for you to be reminded of the truths in God's word. When you picked up your kids today, we provided some verses and stories that you can read this week.



PRAY

Pray with your kids every day. Just like reading the Bible, prayer is a great habit to develop. Start by thanking God before meals. Throw in some prayer time before the kids start the school day. Finishing the day with a bedtime prayer is also awesome. Don't worry, we'll remind the kids to remind you.



TALK

Talk about Jesus as much as possible. Talk about what you can do as a family to draw closer to God. You might even learn something from your kids. You'll be amazed at what they can teach you. WALK

Consider your faith as something that you live out every day, not just on Sundays.
